Cost of Having Unquilted Projects In Your Studio

Example:

Average cost of fabric and other items to make a quilt top (F):	<u> \$100 </u>
Average number of hours to make a quilt top (H):	<u> 6 </u>
Average cost per hour of your labour (L):	<u> \$10 </u>
Labour cost per quilt (C = H x L):	<u> \$60 </u>

Average cost per quilt top (F + C): \$160

Your Calculations:

Average cost of fabric and other items to make a quilt top (F):	<u> \$ </u>

Average cost per hour of your labour (L):	<u> \$ </u>

Cost to Have Your quilts Professionally Quilted

Example:

Number of Quilt Tops Made in 1 Year (Q):	<u> 5 </u>
Average Price for Professionally Quilted (P):	<u> \$100 </u>

Cost to Get Your Projects Quilted (C = Q x P): \$500

Your Calculations:

While this is a theoretical situation, if you did send out all of your quilts tops because you wanted them to be free motion quilted, rather than the way you are currently finishing them, this is what the cost would be.
